English	<p>LO: To change the characters and a new chore for their stories.</p> <p>Look at the basics plot we made yesterday by sequencing the pictures and explain that we are going to change it to make our own stories. I have added a power point of the plot.</p> <p>We are going to looking for new characters for our stories.</p> <p>First, we need some new characters for the family. It is really important that the children stay with the same number of characters.</p> <p>Start with the mother. Do they want to keep that character as a mother or change it to a dad or grandmother?</p> <p>The story will need two siblings. They can keep it as two sisters or have two brothers or a sister and a brother.</p> <p>The witch can be changed to a wizard. His disguises can change to an old man and a knight.</p> <p>Finally, they need a handsome prince or princess.</p> <p>The children now need to make a stick puppet for each of their characters. They will need 6 puppets as the witch or wizard has two disguises.</p> <p>Please share your puppets with me during our zoom session and then keep them safe to bring into school with you on Monday.</p>
Phonics	<p>We will do phonics altogether during our Zoom meeting. Please remember to have a whiteboard and pen.</p>
Maths	<p>Begin by counting in 2s and then 5s to 50.</p> <p>Now look at the activity on todays blog. These sheets can be printed, or the children can just write the answers straight into their exercise books. If using their exercise books, instead of completing the grid the child can write the numbers they would say when counting in 5s to 50.</p>
PE	<p>We are continuing our gymnastics work looking at balance and movements. Please complete the tasks on the sheet on the blog.</p>
Computing	<p>Today you need to complete challenge 4 on 22Go on Purple mash.</p>
Reading	<p>Find a book on Oxford Owl to read</p>
